Robert W. Mooney, MD is certified by the American Board of Addiction Medicine and specializes in Addiction Psychiatry. He was born and raised in Statesboro, GA by parents who were pioneers in the treatment of alcoholism

and drug addiction. He began his career as a certified addiction counselor and is proud to be currently certified as a Master Addiction Counselor by the National Association for Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselors. He graduated from Mercer University School of Medicine in 1991 and completed a residency in Psychiatry from Quillen College of Medicine in 1994. He previously worked as Medical Director at Willingway Hospital for over 20 years and has become known as one of the most knowledgeable and respected physicians in the field of Addiction Medicine. Dr. Mooney states that he was brought to New Mexico by its beauty but is staying at Vista Taos for what it offers the alcoholic and addict. "The shared recovery phenomenon is the most significant life changing intervention in the history of addiction treatment and has resulted from the love of one alcoholic touching the pain of another alcoholic, it doesn't get any better than that!" He has continued his dedication through writing and lecturing extensively in support of total abstinence in the treatment of those suffering from addiction.
